**Education:** university degree in health informatics, computer science, related fields or equivalent education, experience in the development, set-up and maintenance of database and client-server systems, experience with script and programming languages, basic knowledge of requirements and maintenance of biobank IT systems.

**Experience & skills:** knowledge of sample storage and processing in biobanking, experience with patients data (data protection and secrecy), medical knowledge, teaching and training experience, responsible and independent way of working, communication and teamwork skills, IT project management experience.

**Activities & tasks:** setup and administration of an IT biobanking infrastructure at the Medical University of Innsbruck in accordance with the project management and the participating institutions, training of personnel involved in biobanking.

The monthly minimum salary: € 2'457.90 gross (14 times a year). Benefits or overpayment is possible, depending on qualifications and job experience.
